

Deer Park News - City Manager B J Jetter

With the new year under way, we are busy working on current projects and planning for new ones! For example, this year's road project will begin with bidding on several streets with the Greater Cincinnati Water Works for water main replacement with street milling and street repaving. We have already received a SORTA Grant for Plainfield Road, from the corporation line in Sycamore Township south to Silverton, for water main replacement and mill and paving that will begin this year.

In last quarters newsletter we told you about a grant we applied for to complete Phase 2 of the Blue Ash Road Street Scape and we are happy to report OKI has approved a \$4 million grant for this project! Work will begin on the design in early 2023.

We also reported on the conversion of the Tennis Courts in Chamberlin Park to Pickleball Courts. This project has been completed and they are open for playing! By spring, the drinking fountains along the walking path in the park, will all be ADA accessible and have three functions, a lower level water accessory for pets, a regular drinking fountain, and a water bottle refill station.

Good things are happening in the park! We received a grant for \$80,000 from the Hamilton County Commissioners Road Fund for maintaining and improving the walking path. We also received a grant for \$150,000 from the State Capital funds that will be used to start the RFP process on a design/build for a music pavilion in the park.

Our city offices are moving away from paper documents as much as possible. We encourage you to visit our website where you will find forms for each department that can be accessed at any time. We are also happy to inform you that the city has partnered with a company to put all of the city ordinances and building codes on our website. There will be a link on the website where you will be able to look up the guidelines for any project you undertake. That project is underway and should be completed by the end of the first quarter.

Bring your friends and family and enjoy local food from six different places while riding through four unique neighborhoods.



Service Department Update - Ron Schwettman, Foreman

Last fall's curbside vacuum leaf collection ended in mid-December, with 10 rounds made throughout the city, resulting in 70 dump truck loads of leaves picked up. The weekly brush chipping service has now resumed. This service is typically on Fridays, for branches/limbs over 4 feet in length, and 1 to 8 inches in diameter.

Over the last several months the Service Department has installed over 700 feet of storm drainpipe plus rain tile in Chamberlin Park at the upper part of the park, to help alleviate an ongoing drainage issue. Several catch basins were also added in the park during the year. We received a grant for partial funding of this project and doing the work in-house resulted in additional savings to the City.

During the winter, the Service Dept has been readying equipment, especially to be prepared for adverse winter weather. We would like to remind residents that during ice and snow events, to please keep vehicles off the street so that crews – and residents – can more safely get around.



The City of Deer Park is pleased to offer its residents reimbursement for replacing their broken sidewalks through its Sidewalk Program.

As a walking school district and a small city where many folks like to walk their pets, jog, or walk to the grocery or church, we want to

improve the safety of our sidewalks by making it more affordable for residents to replace sidewalk panels that are broken or uneven. In the annual budget, we have allocated \$2,500 toward sidewalk reimbursements.

The program works like this: Residents submit an application and choose a bonded contractor. The City will inspect prior to and after the pouring of cement. Once the job is complete, the resident will submit their receipt for reimbursement. The scale of reimbursement is as follows:


- projects up to \$400 we will reimburse 50%
- projects \$400-750 we will reimburse \$250
- projects \$750-1,000 we will reimburse \$300
- projects over \$1,000 we will reimburse \$400
- corner projects over 90 running feet reimbursed on an individual case basis

Residents doing the work themselves can receive partial compensation for materials used. Brochures with detailed information are available at the city building, 7777 Blue Ash Road or call (513) 794-8860.



FREE Public WIFI – The City has installed 22 access points along the newly improved Blue Ash Road corridor, as well as a section of Galbraith and Plainfield, creating a WiFi "loop" within these main city corridors. Chamberlin Park and the community center are also served by this project.
