City Council Committee Meeting

President Daily opened the meeting at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Works Committee: Chairman Mike Rapp

2019 Road Project

Mr. Rapp motioned to move forward for council consideration of allowing the Safety Service Director to advertise for bids on the 2019 road project for the following streets: Matson Avenue from Quartermaine to corp. line, St. John's Terrace from Plainfield to Monticello Avenue, Monticello, Hegner Avenue from Maple to corp. line and Parrott. Ms. Culver seconded the motion after questions and discussion ensued. Ms. Culver stated that better communication is needed with our residents regarding what we are doing with their streets. Mr. Gavin agreed with Ms. Culver. Mr. Rapp asked if we may have a letter generated for residents. Mr. Jetter stated one will be ready by the May 13, 2019 council meeting. Motion passed by a unanimous voice vote among the Public Works Committee.

Safety Committee: Chairman Tom Camp

Fire Lane from Maple on Hegner to Corp. Line

Mr. Camp spoke on how the road on Hegner Avenue narrows as you get to the Township line. We would like to make a no parking zone from 4331 Hegner to that Township line which is just 4 additional houses then we currently have it set in front of now. This allows safety vehicles to be able to get there and through. Mr. Camp motioned to move forward to council for approval and was seconded by Mr. Lehane. Discussion ensued. Motion passed by a unanimous voice vote among the Safety Committee.

Community Center Fire Arms Policy

Mr. Tassell explained on how carrying concealed weapons is not allowed in government buildings however the Community Center is excluded from this. Because of the nature of the building, if you are drinking you should not carry a concealed weapon. Mr. Tassell motioned to move forward to council for approval. Mr. Camp seconded the motion. Discussion ensued. Motion passed by a unanimous voice vote among the Safety Committee.
